

Graph.


Pluralization

Better represent identity, memory and experiences of communities
Repair harm.
'Just description'

Entification

- Create singular identity ('entification')
- Gather information about entities (e.g. as shown in knowledge cards)
- Create relationships between entities – graph (navigation – citation, co-creation, derivative, affiliation, recommendations, ...)







Project Passage Conclusions


Selected Conclusions

- A Linked Data infrastructure can create data that exceeds current library standards.
- Ontologies are vitally important.
- User interface enhancements to the infrastructure can improve library workflow.
- A knowledge graph requires tools to import external datasets.
- Interoperability between datasets is crucial for import and export.
- Linked data work diminishes the distinction between bibliographic and authority data.


Change in mindset: it's okay to slow down, take care with the problem.

Potential for FAST (Faceted Application of Subject Terminology)


